Legislation

National Right-to-Work Act

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The National Labor Relations Act and Railway Labor Act shall be amended
3 to repeal provisions permitting employers or labor organizations,
4 pursuant to a collective bargaining agreement that is a union security
5 agreement, to require employees to join a union as a condition of
6 employment (including provisions permitting railroad carriers to require,
7 pursuant to such an agreement, payroll deduction of union dues or fees
8 as a condition of employment).

9 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect January 1, 2019. All laws in conflict with this
10 legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Choices in Education Act of 2018

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965/Every Student
3 Succeeds Act is herewith repealed.

4 **SECTION 2.** The Department of Education (ED) is authorized only to award block
5 grants to State local educational agencies (LEAs) based on number of
6 eligible children within each LEA's geographical area. From these
7 amounts, each LEA shall: (1) distribute a portion of funds to parents who
8 elect to enroll their child in a private school or to homeschool their child,
9 and (2) do so in a manner that ensures that such payments will be used
10 for appropriate educational expenses.

11 **SECTION 3.** All funds currently appropriated to ED shall be directed to these block
12 grants, and administration thereof.

13 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect June 1, 2019. All laws in conflict with this
14 legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Terminate the Environmental Protection Agency

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The Environmental Protection Agency shall terminate on December 31,
3 2019.

Restraining Excessive Federal Enforcement & Regulations of Cannabis (REFER) Act of 2018

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** None of the funds made available by any Act of Congress to any
3 department or agency of the United States may be used to:
4 (A). prevent a State or unit of local government from implementing or
5 maintaining its State law or regulation that authorizes the use,
6 distribution, possession, or cultivation of cannabis;
7 (B). detain, prosecute, sentence, or initiate civil proceedings against an
8 individual, business or property, that is involved in the cultivation,
9 distribution, possession, dispensation, or use of cannabis, in accordance
10 with the law or regulation of the State or unit of local government in
11 which the individual is located; or
12 (C). penalize a financial institution solely because the institution provides
13 financial services to an entity that is a manufacturer, producer, or a
14 person that participates in any business or organized activity that
15 involves handling cannabis or cannabis products, or any related activity,
16 and engages in such activity pursuant to a law or regulation established
17 by a State or a unit of local government in which the financial institution
18 is located.

19 **SECTION 2.** The term *financial institution* has the meaning given such term in [section](#)
20 [5312 of title 31](#), United States Code.

21 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect upon passage, and all laws in conflict with this
22 legislation are hereby declared null and void.
